



Healthcare Contributions

Sanofi provides healthcare contributions to support independent, third-party initiatives that align with the company's mission to improve people's lives. Through these no-direct-return contributions to patient advocacy groups, think tanks, and policy institutes, Sanofi helps address critical healthcare needs while maintaining strict ethical standards. This approach allows the company to make a meaningful impact on global health while ensuring supported organisations maintain their independence and integrity.

What is a Healthcare Contribution?

- A financial contribution to a non-profit or charitable organisation to support healthcare-related objectives in therapeutic areas where Sanofi operates.
- This can include support for the mission of a non-profit organisation or an independent specific initiative by the organisation.
- There should also be no direct return for Sanofi.

Healthcare Contributions require the approval of:

1. Sanofi Budget owner
2. Finance
3. Public Affairs (specifically for contributions to Patient Advocacy Groups)

This letter must include the following:

- Detailed project description.
- List of other contributors, if known, or if other contributors are expected.
- Sanofi requested financial contribution amount
- Full budget with detailed breakdown – meaning the budget of the entire project (not limited to Sanofi contribution) and including any potential transfer of value (e.g., speakers' honorarium, accommodations, meals provided).
- Timelines
- Name of signatory for agreement and their email address
