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Sanofi signs Statement of Intent with Queensland Government to explore mRNA clinical manufacturing unit in Australia

Brisbane, Friday 9th June 2023 – Sanofi, one of the world's largest vaccine innovators, has signed a Statement of Intent with the Queensland Government to explore mRNA GMP-grade clinical manufacturing in Australia.

Queensland Deputy Premier Steven Miles MP signed the statement alongside Sanofi's Global Head of Vaccine Research and Development Dr Jean-Francois Toussaint at the BIO International Convention in the United States.

The mutual statement of intent outlines the possibility of Sanofi setting up mRNA GMPgrade clinical manufacturing in Queensland. It would mean Sanofi could conduct more early phase clinical trials in Australia via the Translational Science Hub announced in December. Good Manufacturing Practice (GMP) are principles by the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) to ensure therapeutic goods are of the highest quality.

A delegation of Queensland businesses, universities and research institutions attended the BIO International Convention this week to encourage international investment in Queensland's fast-growing biomedical sector. The Queensland Deputy Premier, along with representatives from Griffith University and the University of Queensland also toured the Sanofi mRNA Centre of Excellence based in Boston. This facility is part of Sanofi's global R&D network that now includes the Translational Science Hub in Queensland.

The Translational Science Hub, announced by Sanofi and the Queensland Government in December, links world-class researchers in Queensland with scientists at the Sanofi mRNA Centre of Excellence in France and the US. This first-of-its-kind partnership,

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which includes the University of Queensland and Griffith University, is putting Queensland at the forefront of vaccine development and biomedical research in Australia.
