Statut and Operation

Enfants de Sanofi is a charity under the 1901 French law, founded in 1993, and independent from Sanofi's hierarchical structures. It is composed of:

• A board of directors

- A sponsorship committee
- A CSR administrative team

Who can submit a request

Any employee can submit a request for individual support using a form available:

- at the association's secretariat:
- with local relays on Sanofi country sites; or
- online on the Sanofi intranet (CSR section).



Intervention Type

An employee whose child is experiencing medical, family, or educational difficulties can apply for individual assistance.

Each year, collective prevention or education actions involving the children of a site, or a country are organized according to local needs. Special operations are set up to help children and families in an emergency, when exceptional events or natural disasters occur.



Confidentiality

All the individual requests received are anonymized when presented to the sponsorship committee. The information collected is managed in accordance with personal data protection regulations.

In 2024, **disability situations** were the main reason for assistance, accounting for **40%** of individual health-related requests, followed by those concerning **special education**

FOCUS ON INDIVIDUAL SUPPORTS FOR CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES IN 2024

In 2024, **68%** of files processed concerned disability, all causes combined, for a budget of $\textbf{\in}262,000$. Autism-related requests continue to rise, with **46** files in 2024, compared with **41** in 2023.

Kuzey Alaz's testimony: When Solidarity Makes All the Difference

Can you tell us how you discovered your baby's illness and how you got through that time?

Our son's illness was discovered when he was just 14 days old. The diagnosis of Type 1 Spinal Muscular Atrophy came as a huge shock. Health authorities quickly referred us to a specialized facility, emphasizing the urgency of starting treatment. Without hesitation, we agreed, and our son received his first therapy at just 21 days old.

What role did moral and financial support play in your journey?

Staying strong emotionally while running our fundraising campaign was incredibly challenging. We explored many ways to reach as many people as possible—social media ads, TV interviews, charity sales, and more.

What stands out to me is that we were not alone. I never imagined that Enfants de Sanofi and my colleagues at Sanofi would support us so much. For us, it truly felt like a miracle!

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Can you tell us about how the treatment in Germany went?

Before receiving the gene therapy, our son underwent several preliminary tests—cardiac exams, blood work, and a physical therapy assessment—which confirmed his eligibility thanks to the absence of symptoms.

The day before the injection was especially stressful, with one final blood test being crucial to confirm there was no infection. The treatment was administered as planned, followed by a three-day hospital stay in strict isolation. Despite a few expected side effects, that moment marked a

decisive turning point in our fight against spinal muscular atrophy—hope finally replaced fear.

What message would you like to share with everyone who helped you?

Ruben's testimony: The journey of a bright child.

Can you tell us about Ruben's journey?

It all started about three years ago. Ruben was first diagnosed with a proprioception disorder—he couldn't even hold a pencil. Doctors advised us to begin occupational therapy, which we did right away. But very quickly, we realized there was something

more. He had significant trouble focusing. His teacher then referred us to an ADHD specialist. That's when we discovered he was also on the autism spectrum, with a diagnosis of Asperger's.

How did you feel when Ruben's diagnosis was announced?

It was very difficult at first. The word "autism" was frightening, especially because we didn't really know what it meant.

We grew up in a time when no one talked about it. When we learned that Ruben was autistic, it felt like our world was falling apart.

What helped you move forward?

The support from Enfants de Sanofi was essential. Thanks to them, Ruben was able to receive tailored care, and that changed our daily life. We also learned to adapt our parenting—to stop comparing him to other children and instead support him in what he does best. Ruben is a neurodivergent child—he thinks differently, and that's what makes him unique. We try to focus on his strengths, not his struggles. It's not an easy journey, but we're moving forward, one day at a time.

How do you see his future today?

Honestly, before the financial support from Enfants de Sanofi, we were worried. We even used to joke that he might live with us forever, because we didn't know if he would succeed in school. But today, thanks to the help he's receiving, we're seeing real progress. Just a few months ago, he couldn't read a single sentence. Last week, he read full sentences with me. It's incredible.

Our collective actions

Enfants de Sanofi also supports collective actions in several countries, to meet specific local needs. These initiatives take the form of vaccination campaigns, health check-ups and other targeted programs for employees' children. To achieve this, we rely on the commitment of our local relays
